

Anti-epileptic drugs (AEDs) are the main form of treatment for people with epilepsy. And up to 70% (7 in 10) people with epilepsy could have their seizures . Antiepileptic medications do not cure epilepsy, but rather attempt to prevent seizures. Strictly speaking, these medications are antiseizure or anticonvulsant.

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Antiepileptic drugs should be used carefully, with consideration of medication interactions and potential side effects. This is particularly.
